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Coronavirus Campus Updates

In an effort to prevent exposures Homewood at Plum Creek implemented the following:

- At this time there are no confirmed cases of Covid-19 on our campus
- We are following the COVID-19 situation very closely and working with many agencies to prepare and implement our current and future plans
- Covid-19 is confirmed across the country and in our commonwealth
- We are working and will continue to work diligently to minimize exposure and risk for our campus residents
- For family members and friends of residents who live in our healthcare center and personal care settings we are restricting nonessential visitation
- Anyone entering any of our buildings both town hall and community center, must have a health screening completed which includes a temperature taken, a review for travel to high risk areas and review of COVID-19 symptoms which are fever, cough and shortness of breath.
- Anyone entering Windows Dining Room for meals will also have the health screening completed and hand sanitizer must be used.
- Our campus activities and group functions will be limited to only our campus residents. This includes Windows Dining Room.
- We will not be utilizing salad bars or buffets across the campus until further notice.

Ways you can prepare:

- Good handwashing
- Limiting public exposure off campus
- Limiting visitation with those who have recently traveled or may have been around groups with possible exposure. (i.e. college students, business travelers, etc.) High risk countries include Italy, Japan, South Korea, China, Iran, Hong Kong. As of right now the following states in the United States; Washington, California and New York have been identified as areas with community transmission, however this list may change daily.

- Take an inventory of supplies you would need and make sure you are prepared if you were to become ill (i.e. Tylenol Motrin, fever reducers, cough medicines, comfort foods, prescription medications, common household products).
 - Fever reducing medications such as Tylenol and Motrin, cough medicines
 - Prescription medications
 - Common household products
 - Comfort Foods
 - Non-perishable foods
 - Fluids to stay hydrated

Homewood is being extremely preventative at this time and we want you too as well.
